CALIFORNIA HISTORICAL LANDMARKS:

*LOS ANGELES COUNTY

Have you been to any of these landmarks?

#127 - Casa de Governor Pio Pico. 6003 Pioneer Blvd. (jct Hwy 72 and I-605), Whittier. Following the Mexican War, Pio Pico, last Mexican govenor, acquired 9,000-acre Rancho Paso de Bartolo and built here an adobe home that was destroyed by the floods of 1883-1884. His second adobe casa, now known as Pio Pico Mansion, represents a compromise between Mexican and American cultures. While living here the ex-Governor was active in the development of American California.

#150 - Brand Park (Memory Garden). San Fernando Blvd., Los Angeles Brand Park, was given to the city for a park November 4, 1920. It is part of the original land grant of Mission San Fernando de Re de España, and the colorful and picturesque atmosphere of the early California missions is preserved in Memory Garden.

#151 - Campo de Cahuenga. "Here was made the Treaty of Cahuenga by General Andres Pico, commanding forces for Mexico, and Lt. Col. J.C. Fremont, U.S. Army, for the United States. By this treaty, agreed upon January 13, 1847, the United States acquired California; finally secured to us by the treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, made February 2, 1848." This legend was written February 9, 1898, by Mrs. Jessie Benton Fremont.
